**Co-Requisite Courses**—Pre-requisites and co-requisites (also known as concurrent pre-requisites) are two kinds of entry requirements for particular courses. You must satisfy prerequisites, or their equivalent, before registering for a course. You must enroll in a co-requisite course at the same time you register in the other course. In most cases, you can register for the other course if you have already successfully completed the co-requisite. Pre-requisites and co-requisites are identified in the course descriptions at the back section of the catalog.

- This is a 1 + 2 + 1 BSN curriculum with ADN exit after Year 3 that:
  - reduces barriers to BSN level
  - Improves seamless transfer/articulation
  - reduces duplication
  
- Del Mar College is working to help create a consortium of community colleges and universities that would agree to the RN to BSN Pathway. Currently we have articulation agreements with:
  - Texas A&M University Corpus Christi
  - University of Houston at Victoria
  - University of Texas at Tyler
  
- If a student meets the 2 items below, universities in the consortium will agree not to require anymore lower division general education courses (unless they are part of the 30 hours at University)
  - Have completed 54 hours general education hours set in the curriculum above
  - Have transcript marked CORE COMPLETE
